- Goal #3:** Building and strengthening relationships with our community through mission and service.

2009 C-Net Ministry Opportunities

PRAYERS

1. Personal Prayer

Take time to nurture your relationship with God through regular personal prayer and devotion.

2. Prayer Vigils

Participate in occasional “team prayers” for specific events and/or needs, either in the Chapel or at home.

PRESENCE

Traditional Worship & Music Ministry

3. Worship

Attend and participate in weekly Worship gatherings.

4. Ushers

Assist in Worship, ie: handing out bulletins, greeting, watch for and attend to guests, collect offerings, collect and replace registration pads, straighten between services, assist with Communion. *Special training required.*

5. Scripture Readers

Offer leadership in Worship by reading the Scripture. *Special training offered.*

6. Acolyte

Mid-High: assist the Ministers during Worship, i.e. lighting the candles, and during the Offering; **Senior High:** assist with Baptisms and Holy Communion. *Special training required.*

7. Nursery Assistants

Assist with supervision of children in the Sunday morning nursery, or for special church events.

8. Communion Servers

Senior High: Assist Ministers by serving Communion.

9. Children's Moments

Senior High: Lead the children in a 1-3 minute lesson on the day's Scripture during Worship services. *Special training required.*

10. Ministry Moments

Be willing to speak to the congregation from the pulpit on a Sunday in order to tell them about a ministry at Trinity that is particularly meaningful to you, and to thank them for supporting it.

11. Special Music (Vocal/Instrumental)

Contribute to a musical Act of Praise during Worship.

12. Chancel Choir

Senior High: Choir rehearses Wednesday evenings at 7 p.m.. This choir sings on Sundays at 10:45, and special events throughout the year.

Non-Traditional Worship & Music Ministry

13. Youth Praise Team

Offer vocal or instrumental leadership during Sunday School and for special events.

14. canvascommunity Worship

Attend and participate in the canvas offering on Sunday morning at 8:30 or Monday evening at 7 in Martin Hall.

15. canvascommunity Leaders/Musicians/Vocalists

Assist with Worship each week by reading Scripture, helping with Holy Communion, or by singing or playing a musical instrument.

16. canvaskids Leaders

Assist with the Children's Time during weekly Worship.

17. Support Team

Run multimedia presentations and assist with set-up and breakdown. *Training provided.*

Hospitality & Kinship Ministries (Welcome & Fellowship)

18. “Everyone’s-A-Host”

Be alert to unfamiliar youth near your age in the church before, during or after Sunday School, worship, and youth meetings, during fellowship meals or special events; make a point of smiling, saying, “hi” and helping them feel welcome. Invite them to sit with you and your friends, and invite them to come again.

19. Name Tags

Help other members and guests get to know you by wearing your church name tag every Sunday.

20. Fellowship Dinner Helpers

Work with adults on the Kitchen Team, helping to set-up and clean-up a fellowship meal on Wednesday, or at a special occasion meal.

21. Tutoring or Mentoring

Mid & Senior High: Help our children with their homework on Wednesday nights following the Fellowship Dinner; or **Senior High:** Become a social and spiritual mentor for a Mid-High Youth, a member of the Confirmation Class, or Believer’s Village Child.

Discipleship Ministries (Education)

22. Wednesday Night Classes & Activities

Participate regularly in the classes and events that take place from 6-6:50 on Wednesdays during the School Year.

23. Student Ministry Participants

Attend regularly, and actively participate in Sunday School, Sunday evening Youth activities, retreats, special events, and trips.

24. Gender Groups

Boys and Girls (age-level) are kept separate for these small-group fellowship/fun gatherings with an adult mentor/facilitator. You will build relationship skills and learn how to live-out your faith in everyday life.

25. Sunday School Class Helpers

Help your class by calling, Face Booking or sending postcards to absent members, encouraging their attendance the next week.

26. “D-groups”

(Disciple Groups) Attend and participate in (age-level) faith groups designed for students, Grades 6-12.

GIFTS

27. Stewardship

Build a practice of good personal stewardship as you give a financial offering in worship each week.

28. Spiritual Gifts

Participate in a class designed to help you find out which spiritual gifts God has blessed you with, and learn how to use them in the ministries He has called you to.

SERVICE

Mission, Administrative & Evangelism Ministries

29. Student Missions

Participate in Youth Mission projects and trips.

30. Miracle Team

Senior High: serve a three-year rotation as a Youth Liaison/Representative on the church-wide mission team. Participate in their work, and/or engage their direct support for youth mission efforts.

31. Administrative Ministries

Mid- or Senior High: Serve on the Youth Council or as a Youth Representative on the Family Council. **Senior High:** Serve as a Youth Liaison/Representative on the Evangelism, Hospitality, Kinship or Discipleship Team, or as a Youth Reporter for the Communications Team.

WITNESS

32. Reach-Out

Show others what it means to love and honor Christ by your own words and actions. Be intentional about inviting non-members to Youth Activities, Youth Sunday School, and Traditional or Non-Traditional Worship.

Make a careful exploration of who you are and the work you have been given, and then sink yourself into that. Don't be impressed with yourself. Don't compare yourself with others. Each of you must take responsibility for doing the creative best you can with your own life.
